VPN New Features

SAML Single Logout Support	SAML Single Logout (SLO) is the protocol that allows users to logout from Service Provider (SP) as well as Identity Provider (IdP) and requiring users to provide credentials again upon next SAML authentication.

VPN Fixed Issues

The following table lists issues that have been fixed and are resolved by upgrading to this release.

Problem Report Number	Summary
Release 9.2.0	
PRS-377451	FQDN Split Tunneling configured with one or more deny rule passes all the traffic through the physical adapter instead of tunneling it.
PRS-391457	During an "Always ON" VPN session, if the device reboots, the Knox framework tries to start the VPN connection after the device comes up and an error is thrown on the debugger.
PRS-393500	In Android 6.0 devices, VPN connection with certificate authentication fails due to the Pulse client crash.
PRS-393878	FQDN Split tunneling behavior issue due to pattern match error between *.test.com and refertest.com resource.
PRS-394047	VPN connection fails with error "Server's security certificate is not trusted." as the hostname present in the SAN field of the device certificate is ignored.

PAND-3855	Symptom : Once Idle timeout expire, sometimes OnDemand VPN is not getting triggered upon launching the whitelisted Apps.
	Condition: When launching the whitelisted Apps to trigger the OnDemand VPN.
	Workaround: Reboot the device.
